

# 19TH CENTURY FRENCH PAINTING & SCULPTURE

**APA Program:** Paris

Language of instruction: French

**US semester credits:** 4.0 **Term:** Fall Semester

**Class:** This course meets twice per week: once in the classroom and once in a corresponding museum.

## **Course Description**

In order to study the great artistic movements and the principal artists that were prominent throughout the 19th century in France, this art history course was designed in a unique manner. The period is known as being particularly rich in major transformations and transitions in politics, art and technique. Students will have the incredible opportunity to not only explore the period in the classroom but in the museum. By allowing students the possibility to discover, first hand, the works that they are studying, the approach will be both concrete and significant.
