

FRANCOPHONE CINEMA IN FOCUS: SUB-SAHARAN AFRICA AND THE MAGHREB

Course Description

The six-week online course is a survey of Francophone cinema, examining productions from Sub-Saharan Africa and North Africa. The course provides a comprehensive look at the history of cinema in the selected Francophone spaces, conditions of film production and distribution, and discussion of overlapping themes. The survey covers the period from the 1960s to present.

Course Objectives

- Developing a deep understanding of the interrelations between cinema and sociopolitical context;
- Engaging students into a critical analysis on how film medium can effect social change;
- Situating and assessing Francophone cinema within the larger world film industry.

Distance learning: course delivery via Zoom

Meeting days and times: Four days a week (Monday through Thursday). Each class session takes 75 minutes.

Guest speakers: invited African filmmakers will join the class every week for discussions.

Pre-requisites: Students have expected to have access to streaming platforms (Amazon Video, Netflix, Kanopy, etc.) to watch films on their own prior to class meetings.
